As she was on her journey to leave her abuser and permanently relocate to Arizona, she found her authentic self and life's work. In Arizona, MonaLou met other survivors and advocates who wanted to make a difference. In 2002, she created the National Advocacy & Training Network (NATN). A key to their success is their SEEDs (Support, Education, Empowerment, and Direction) program, addressing the unmet needs of battered and sexually abused women in recovery.

MonaLou understands that it takes months, if not years, to put your life back together, especially when children are involved. Based on her expertise and experience with co-occurring issues, MonaLou is asked to educate law enforcement, healthcare providers, community agencies, and professional service agencies on how abuse is intertwined and cannot be treated in a silo. She even spoke at Parliament.

Unfortunately, COVID-19 has had an impact on how NATN delivers their programs. Their support groups are meeting online; some of the women in their homes have lost their jobs; and their Cup O'Karma community café closed. Cup O'Karma was a job training and social venture program. They are in search of a new location once COVID-19 restrictions are lifted.

Thanks to Sheri Tapia, the nominating member who introduced this charity to 100+ Women Who Care, the charity will have funds to support their homes. "You have no idea how amazing this donation is at this time. Because of COVID, we have lost so many of our funders," shared MonaLou Callery. "This donation allows us to keep our homes open for at least three months. That is a long time to house 26 women. It could not have come at a better time."
