100+ Women support kids with deadly illnesses

Faced with unimaginable grief, Kameron's parents, Debbie and Bryce, found solace in channeling their pain into a force for good. They vowed to honor their son's memory by spreading joy and support to those experiencing similar life-threatening diseases.

Kameron's Krusaders launched initia-

tives aimed at providing aid and comfort to individuals and families. It serves children at Phoenix Children Hospital by supplying them with monthly snacks and seasonal gift "buckets" filled with toys and goodies.

The group supports families by do-

nating gas and grocery gift cards to lessen the financial burden. It donates to programs like Animal-Assisted Therapy through fundraising events such as Phoenix Children's "Dine with Your Dog."

In 2022, it launched "The Holiday

Family Extravaganza" where members adopt families and provide holiday gifts.

From organizing fundraisers to offering emotional support, Kameron's Krusaders has quickly become a beacon of hope for many. In times of struggle, it's easy to feel isolated and alone. However, through their unwavering support and compassion, this organization reminds us that, no matter the obstacles we face, we are never truly alone.

In January, Debbie Sherman shared the mission of Kameron's Krusaders with her 100+ Women Who Care Valley of the Sun group in the East Valley. The members were moved by her presentation and selected the charity to receive their quarterly donations. Kameron's Krusaders was awarded \$10,725.

"With each member's generous donation, we can expand our reach into the community throughout the year and especially around the holidays. With the ability to support additional families, as
